The Eraser Devotion

Lesson



There once was a little girl who was in 2nd grade. Whenever she made a mistake at school, the teacher would write her name on the board and put a check mark next to her name. If she made another mistake, the teacher would put another check mark next to her name. Then another check mark. The little girl kept looking at those check marks and felt horrible. Nothing she did could make them go away. Just as school was about to end, there was a knock at the classroom

door. The door opened and in walked Jesus. He walked right up to the board, picked up the eraser, and wiped away the check marks that were next to the little girl's name. Then He drew a big red heart around her name. From then on, no one could put a check mark by her name because the big red heart was her protection.

Activity

Give each child a piece of paper. Have them write their name in the middle. Brainstorm a few examples of ways they had sinned or fallen short that day. When they say them out loud, have them draw check marks next to their name. Then tell them the Bible verse below and have them erase the checkmarks and put a big red heart around their name.

Bible Verse

"So turn away from your sins. Turn to God. Then your sins will be wiped away. The time will come when the Lord will make everything new." Acts 3:19

Just for Fun

Get a whiteboard and write the word SIN on it in Sharpie marker. Discuss how sometimes our sin can feel like a Sharpie - permanent and not going anywhere. Bring out a red Expo marker and explain the power of Jesus' blood shed on the cross to remove all of our sins. Take the marker and slowly go back over the Sharpies lines. The Sharpie lines should disappear. That is the power of Jesus' blood!







Class Locations

 Marleen said the teens could continue to meet in the basement of the parsonage, so class locations will be the same as last year.

> Funds

- Current fund balance available: \$1,629.75
- Discussed needs for classes: Jo is looking for a used Keurig for the teen class

Curriculum & Materials

- Same as last year? Jo will take care of getting materials for teens; Loy will order curriculum for other classes.
- Discussion about Middle School (Loy's) class: Would it be possible to incorporate some type of fun, hands-on learning activity (an experiment, challenge or demonstration) that pertains to the lesson? Something really simple, like the cloud demonstration that Loy did for the group last term. A couple of the boys have expressed that they would like to do something other than worksheets. These kiddos are smart and have an interest in science, technology, engineering and

math. It was suggested that perhaps there are books our there with these types of activities. A couple of us will do some research and share findings with the group.

> Schedule

- Start date: September 15th
 - Kickoff event or activity? Think about this and come to the next meeting with some ideas.
- End date: May 17th
- Time: Discussion was held regarding a change up in the morning routine when the kids get there. Sunday School starts at 9:30 AM, but the kids trickle in from 9:30 -10:00. Getting them to sing/participate some mornings can be a challenge because they're not quite awake. It was suggested that maybe we play some praise & worship music and let the kids come in and have their snack first and interact with each other, maybe share a "rose and a thorn" from their week... and then have their lesson. Renee will work on creating a space ("the snack shack") for the kids to sit together and do this.

- Private Facebook group encourage dads to join this group too!
- Compile list of cell phone numbers to text parents
- Utilize the automated calling service

> 2018/2019 Projects

- A discussion was held on the projects that the students would participate in this year and will include both local and worldwide projects:
 - FALL Local Project: Adopt-an-Adult Secret Pal Have the kids randomly draw the name of an adult from the congregation to adopt as a secret pal. Come up with a list of adults and a list of ideas for the kids. Maybe challenge them to do something kind for their secret pal once a month? A group of siblings could adopt someone too, if this would be easier for some parents. Ask Christian to put these things together for the next meeting.
 - FALL Worldwide Project: Encourage the kids to participate in Miss Mary's Shoebox Ministry. Schedule a day during Sunday School or after church for the kids to fill the boxes. Maybe after a luncheon? Boxes were due on November 12th last year.

- SPRING Local Project: Fulton County In Bloom Replanting the kids flower pots and possibly creating some new areas for plantings.
 - We also discussed preparing the current flower pots and beds for winter. A "work day" will be planned following the contemporary worship service and luncheon on October 6th? We did it in November last year.
- **SPRING Worldwide Project:** Heifer Project we will likely kick this off with another Board Game Olympics in January or February.

> Activities

- Back-to-School Bash August 13th Todd & Renee Earley's
 - Renee stated that the kids could swim from 3:00 5:00 PM; food at 5:30 (Seleen will create a sign-up sheet). They will have volleyball and cornhole for the kids to play. Parents are also invited to attend. Bring lawn chairs.

Monthly Memory Verses

- We have done the Random Acts of Kindness for the past two years, but Seleen feels it is time to do something else.
- Discussion was held on giving the kids a simple, practical verse to memorize each month and display it somewhere in the basement (bulletin board?).
- Perhaps at the end of each month, have the kids share how they actually lived out the verse in their daily lives (in conjunction with Sunday Funday?).
- It was suggested that the kids could also create a picture (supplies?) of what the verse means to them and these could be displayed in the church and/or shared with the congregation?
 Perhaps these memory verses could somehow be incorporated into the children's message during worship service?
- Come up with a list of scriptures. At the end of the term, we could
 give the kiddos some laminated 3x5 cards of all the verses on a ring
 to take home.
- Everyone was asked to give this idea some more thought until the next meeting.

Sunday Fundays

- Last year, we got the kids donuts as a reward for filling the Random Acts of Kindness jar and did a fun activity.
- It was suggested that we simplify things and maybe set a schedule for a fun day each month, for example...
 - SEP Wear Your Favorite Color; OCT Funny Hat or Hairdo; NOV -Plaid or Polka Dots; DEC - Red and Green; JAN - Pajamas; FEB -

- Sports Team; MAR Crazy Socks; APR Rainbow; MAY Beach Party
- The kids could create their memory verse pictures and have a fun snack (create parent sign-up sheet) on a certain Sunday each month. Maybe the first Sunday of the month in conjunction with Contemporary Worship Service?
- Kids Takeover Service We definitely want to do this again!
 - Discussion was also held on how to incorporate the kids into our worship services in general. Perhaps the call and response?
 Scripture reading? Marleen mentioned that a Worship Committee will be formed to discuss how we want to worship; this committee will meet a half-hour before the Consistory meeting on the third Tuesday of each month.
 - It was suggested that maybe we could have a service each month where the kids could participate more? The first Sunday of the month in conjunction with Contemporary Worship Service?

> Youth Group

- Renee reported that an August date will be scheduled for the next meeting. 6th graders will be invited to attend; the older kids will be assigned younger kids to mentor.
