
Other activities will include games for the youth, light refreshments, and fellowship for everyone. Times for the afternoon event to be determined later.

St. Paul's TIME TO GET PACKING FOR SHOEBOXES



St. Paul's UCC will again be participating in the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, by packing shoeboxes filled with gifts of joy for

children around the world. Mary Haubrick reports that since 2007, St. Paul's has donated a total of 454 boxes with simple gifts and the message of hope through Jesus Christ that these children are loved and not for-

gotten.

Empty shoeboxes and information will be available at the church beginning Sunday, Oct. 6. You may also use your own empty cardboard shoebox or purchase a plastic shoebox with lid.

The Children and Adult Sunday School classes are going to fill boxes on November 3rd in lieu of lessons that day. You may start bringing in donations to fill the boxes any time. There will be a "collection area" for items in the upstairs Sunday School Room. A list of suggested items to donate is included in this newsletter.

A donation of \$9 is requested for each shoe box to help cover shipping and project costs. FOR OLDER GIRLS:

Small sewing kit Clip on earrings Jewelry

Coin Purse Ink Pad and stamp set Colored Sharpies

A friendship bracelet with extra string so they can make more.

- DO NOT INCLUDE: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; Candy or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans
- **TOYS:** include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.
- **SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
- NON-LIQUID HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.
- **ACCESSORIES:** t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.
- A PERSONAL NOTE: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.
- Additional tips that may help: <u>DO NOT PACK ANY CANDY OR TOOTHPASTE!</u>

Remove packaging from your items so that you allow for more room in your box and so that they don't have much trash to throw away.


