

Caring and Change Can Stimulate

Recently a friend told me the following joke:

"How many people does it take to change a light bulb in the church?" The answer: four...one to change the bulb...and three to reminisce about how good the old bulb was".

Change is not a popular word in many churches. The motto seems to be: "As it was in the beginning, it now and ever shall be." And yet, occasional changes can break up the routine monotony, raise interest, and actually produce some productive growth.

Harvard University conducted an experiment a number of years ago in the world of business and industry that turned up some rather remarkable insights and results. They did some experiments on ways to increase the production at a Midwestern factory.

They began by piping in music to the production floor...and production rates increased and went up. Next, they added extra bright lighting...and production went up. Then after a few weeks, they took away the music, and production stayed up. The lighting was lowered, and production stayed up.

After interviewing the factory employees, it became apparent that it wasn't the individual changes (music and lighting) that were making the difference. It was the fact that the factory supervisors and leaders were willing to show interest in the employees...taking the time and effort to care about them... by making changes in their work environment. The employees responded positively...and on the job attendance remained strong, and production went up.

The conclusion was that change and caring about people can stimulate growth, and definitely perk up human interest. With this information in mind, and many congregations struggling with attendance and membership participation... could God be sending us a message???

At the joint meeting of the Consistories of St. Paul's and Trinity the possibility of switching the times of Sunday services was discussed.
