


DIY Christmas Pageant @ Trinity




Dear Friends in Christ,

The Faith & Fellowship Center Up Date

The Faith & Fellowship Center Building Committee was able to meet with a representative from the CES Engineering group during the second week in October. It was reported that some building materials are starting to come down in cost.

Projects are picking up, especially for local construction groups, and general contractors are making plans for the new year.

Estimated costs of construction are higher now than before the pandemic, but are slowly trending downward.



After considering all the present and projected future information, the Committee presented to the Consistory a plan that would have the engineering group prepare drawings for contractors to begin the bidding process in January 2022. At that time when the bids are opened, a more realistic cost of the project would be revealed. The Consistory at that time can either accept a "reasonable" bid, or reject all bids.

In the discussions between the Committee and the Consistory, it was felt that there needs to be movement forward in this project, treading water is no longer an option. The Consistory is aware that many congregational members have already generously committed themselves to this project. And they are also aware, there are others waiting to see if some action steps are going to be taken to get this construction project off the ground.

Trinity Faith Formation Plan, Step-by-Step

Step 2: Implement 4-key "cross+generational" events across the year to connect families with church leaders and each other - Cross+generational events are activities where Christian children and youth are surrounded by Christian adults of multiple generations modeling their own faith. These events are perfect for sharing the 4 keys for practicing faith. The 4 keys are devotions, caring conversations, rituals and traditions, and service. Devotions focus on the word of God. Caring conversations express an interest in our friends and neighbors. Rituals and traditions give our young people and new Christians insight into the faith practices with which we grew up. Service reaches out to our neighbors through learning, listening, and actions. Work with church leaders to identify existing "cross+generational" special events that could incorporate the 4-key methodology, i.e. Vacation Bible School family night, Harvest event at the pavilion, Advent church decorating and carol sing, Community Easter Sunrise Service. Cross+generational means more than intergenerational. The "cross+" indicates that where 2 or more are gathered, Jesus will be with us. We just completed a wonderful cross+generational activity in the Fall Harvest Party at Trinity Pavilion. Many thanks to the Zeis-Hege family for doing all the planning and set up. Being together on Friday evening October 22 was a real blessing! We look forward to an Advent cross+generational event. If you enjoy our cross+generational events, please become a part of the planning and implementation. These events are for you, your family, and your friends.
