






Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Project "Go therefore and make disciples"---Matthew 28:19-20

St. Paul's UCC will again be participating in the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, by packing shoeboxes filled with gifts of joy for children around the world. Mary Haubrick reports that since 2007, St. Paul's has donated a total of 590 boxes with simple gifts and the message of hope through Jesus Christ that these children are loved and not forgotten.

Empty shoeboxes and information will be available at the church beginning Sunday, Oct. 10. You may also use your own empty cardboard shoebox or purchase a plastic shoebox with lid.

DEADLINE FOR RETURNING THE FILLED BOXES TO ST. PAUL'S IS SUNDAY, NOV. 14.

◆ A donation of \$9 is requested for each shoe box to help cover shipping and project costs. If you are not able to shop to fill a shoebox, you can still participate by your donations that will be a great help to this special ministry. A gift to Operation Christmas Child helps cover processing and shipping expenses and allows teams to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with children and their families. Make checks payable to Samaritan's Purse with a note on the memo line "Operation Christmas Child", and give donation to Mary Haubrick

DO NOT INCLUDE: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; Candy or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

TOYS: include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

- **SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
- NON-LIQUID HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.
- **ACCESSORIES:** t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

SUGGESTIONS TO PACK IN AN OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX

Plastic Cup Matchbox cars, trucks, etc. Dolls

Flip Flop shoes Small Stuffed Animals Doll Accessories

T Shirts Pants...short or long Dresses

FOR OLDER BOYS:

Tools—hammer, screwdriver, wrench or pliers, duct tape, measuring tape

Small Fishing Kit, fishing line, hooks Binoculars

Watch Collapsible Water Bottle Small calculator

Handkerchief Soccer ball (collapsed) and Ball Pump

FOR OLDER GIRLS:

Small sewing kit Clip on earrings Jewelry

Coin Purse Ink Pad and stamp set Colored Sharpies

A friendship bracelet with extra string so they can make more.

- A PERSONAL NOTE: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.
- Additional tips that may help: DO NOT PACK ANY CANDY OR TOOTHPASTE!

Remove packaging from your items so that you allow for more room in your box and so that they don't have much trash to throw away.

In culture


In creation.
